The American Chiropractic Association (ACA) is leading the chiropractic profession in the most constructive and far-reaching ways — by working hand in hand with other healthcare professionals, by lobbying for pro-chiropractic legislation and policies, by supporting meaningful research and by using that research to inform treatment practices. ACA is leading a modern movement of chiropractic care based on higher standards and a focus on patient outcomes. It is our mission to inspire and empower our members to elevate the health and wellness of their communities.

We are pleased to have this opportunity to provide the following updates on key association initiatives and programs to members of the United Virginia Chiropractic Association:

Clinician Practice Information Survey (CPI) Distributed

ACA has joined more than 170 healthcare groups in support of a national effort to collect data that will be used to accurately determine physician practice expenses. Information collected through the Clinician Practice Information (CPI) Survey will help policymakers better understand the costs associated with modern practices and to support physician payment advocacy. The objective of the CPI survey is to help document changes in the U.S. healthcare delivery system that impact your practice every day. One of the recurring comments that organizers hear from physicians is that decision-makers and payers are not fully informed about the broad clinical, operational, and financial challenges that their practices face. The study represents an opportunity to communicate accurate financial and operational information to policymakers, including Congress and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS). Data currently used to determine payment levels was last collected by CMS in 2006, making it critical to gather updated information at this time. The 333 doctors of chiropractic included in the CPI's random sample received email invitations to participate in February 2024 and will be able to complete the survey through June. Support Continues to Grow for Medicare Bill

The cosponsor count for ACA's Medicare equality legislation, the Chiropractic Medicare Coverage Modernization Act, now exceeds 160. That is the most cosponsors the legislation has had over its entire history. The momentum of the bill was boosted by ACA members and students who conducted more than 250 meetings with members of Congress and their staff in January during ACA's annual meeting, Engage 2024. These meetings enabled DCs to share not only research and data about the profession, but also the stories of real patients who have benefited from their care. The bill, if passed, would ensure that Medicare beneficiaries have access to all Medicare-covered services that DCs are licensed to provide in their state, which in many areas includes evaluation and management services, diagnostic imaging, and other nondrug therapies. The change would put chiropractors on par with all other physicians within the Medicare system and make it possible for the profession to work toward other improvements. ACA Members Appointed to Key Advisory Positions

As part of its efforts to increase the chiropractic profession's influence in the healthcare industry and policy circles, ACA encourages and assists members applying for key leadership and advisory positions. In the past year, three ACA members were appointed to three separate advisory councils of the National Quality Forum, ACA joined the National Association of Community Health Centers, and ACA President Leo Bronston, DC, was appointed to the AMA's Current Procedural Terminology (CPT®) Editorial Panel. In addition, the first cohort of ACA's newly launched Health Policy Fellowship was selected. The cohort (2024-25) is composed of three ACA members, including Cynthia Chapman, DC, MPH, of Occoquan, Va. The group is getting valuable exposure this year to issues surrounding health policy and coding. ChiroCongress has had a very busy and productive start to 2024. Several ChiroCongress Board members were in attendance for the ACA's Engage in Washington, DC January 25-27. The board had meetings with the ACA and ICA Boards. Dr. Wetzen also met with Dr. Anthony Lisi - Dr. Lisi is the Chiropractic Program Director for the Veterans Health Administration, and Chiropractic Section Chief in the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine at the VA Connecticut Healthcare System. He had discussions with Dr. Lisi relevant to the on-going issues that Virginia Dr.'s are having with the VA and Community Care program in the Norfolk area.

Several Board members also attended Parker Las Vegas February 21-24. Dr. Thomas Wetzen participated in The Summit meeting on Feb. 21. Standard Process was the sponsor for the meeting and gave an amazing tour of their manufacturing facility, their 900 acre organic certified farm and provided the space for the meeting. The meeting progressed over 2 days with a large overall emphasis on updating and creating new items for the strategic plan to work on bringing more value and programs to the state associations. The Board also reviewed, updated and voted on bylaw and policy changes.

One of the new items will be the Executive Leadership Forum (ELF) in Dallas in May for state association ED's to share ideas and collaborate on association issues.

The Board had updates on Clinical Compass, Chiropractic Future Strategic Plan, and ChiroCongress Cares. ChiroCongress shared that they had awarded it's 1st Legacy of Leadership \$5,000 scholarship named in honor of Dr. Tom Klapp and a Maui Relief Fund distribution. The 2024 Legacy of Leadership Scholarship will be named in honor Dr. Louis Sportelli. Applications for eligible students as well as applications for naming of the 2025 scholarship is open and will be awarded at the Annual ChiroCongress Convention in Denver November 14-16.
